Techie Australia is a not-for-profit organisation that takes donated technology—such as laptops, tablets, and accessories—and gives them a second life. Our team refurbishes and prepares these devices, then distributes them to schools, students, and community groups that need them most.

We believe that access to technology is essential for learning, creativity, and opportunity. Every student should be able to research, create projects, connect with others, and build the skills they'll need for the future, no matter their background.

By working with schools, families, and organisations, we're helping to close the digital divide in Australia. Each device we repurpose means one more student can take part fully in their education.

# TECH DRIVE

## TURNING UNUSED DEVICES INTO POWERFUL LEARNING TOOLS

### **What it is**

A Tech Drive is a collection of unused laptops, tablets, and accessories from your school community, family, or friends. Many people have working devices at home that they no longer use. Collecting these gives them a new life with students who need them most.

### **Why it matters**

Every device you collect can be refurbished by Techie Australia and passed on to a student who doesn't have access to technology. Even a small Tech Drive can create real change by helping another student complete their schoolwork, explore new ideas, and connect with the world.

### **How to do it**

1. Pick a collection spot (like your classroom, library, or office).
2. Work with your teacher to spread the word — posters, announcements, or a newsletter item are great ways to promote it.
3. Set a time frame (one to two weeks works best).
4. At the end, arrange to hand the devices over to Techie Australia so they can be repaired and prepared for new owners.

### **Impact**

A Tech Drive doesn't just collect devices; it gives students the tools they need to learn, create, and succeed. It's one of the most powerful ways a single Exhibition project can make a lasting difference.



# HELPING HANDS FUNDRAISER

## STUDENTS SUPPORTING STUDENTS THROUGH TECHIE.

### **What it is**

This activity is about raising money to support Techie Australia. The fundraiser doesn't need to be technology-related; it could be a cake stall, a read-a-thon, a raffle, or even a casual clothes day at school.

### **Why it matters**

Every dollar raised helps us buy the parts, chargers, and accessories we need to get donated devices back into working order. It means more laptops and tablets can be placed in the hands of students who need them most.

### **How to do it**

1. Pick a fundraising idea that excites you.
2. Plan it with your teacher so it's simple, safe, and fun.
3. Spread the word through posters, announcements, or newsletters.
4. Donate the funds raised to Techie Australia.

### **Impact**

Your event doesn't just raise money, it powers real change. The funds you collect will directly turn unused devices into working tools for students, giving them new opportunities to learn and succeed.

# COMMUNITY AWARENESS

## SHARING THE MESSAGE SO OTHERS CAN TAKE ACTION TOO.



### **What it is**

A Community Awareness Drive is about spreading the word so more people know about the digital divide and how Techie Australia is working to close it. By sharing the message, you help other families, schools, and community members understand the problem and how they can help.

### **Why it matters**

Awareness is often the first step that leads to action. When people know about the digital divide, they are more likely to donate devices, contribute funds, or support Techie's work. Every conversation, poster, or article can spark someone else to get involved.

### **How to do it**

1. Work with your teacher to choose the best ways to share the message (posters, newsletter articles, presentations, or a school website feature).
2. Prepare simple, clear information about what the digital divide is and how Techie Australia helps.
3. Share your work widely: in class, at assemblies, in newsletters, or online through school channels.
4. Encourage others to pass the message along to their families and networks.

### **Impact**

By raising awareness, you help build a community of supporters around Techie Australia. Your efforts can inspire device donations, encourage fundraising, and ensure more students get the technology they need to succeed.
